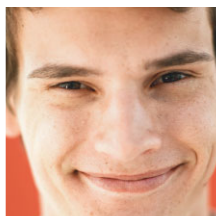


Immunization Schedule...

• Newborn

- o Hepatitis B
 - Usually given in the hospital, but can be given in the office at the first visit.

• 2 Months

- o Hepatitis B
- o Pentacel
 - Pentacel combines the DTaP, Polio and Hib vaccines into one shot.
- o Prevnar 13
- o RotaTeq
 - Rotateq is an oral vaccine.

• 4 Months

- o Pentacel
- o Prevnar 13
- o RotaTeq

• 6 Months

- o Hepatitis B
- o Pentacel
- o Prevnar 13
- o RotaTeq

• 9 Months

- o No shots unless we are catching up from those not given previously.

• 12 Months

- o MMR (measles, mumps, rubella)
- o Varivax (chicken pox)
- o Hepatitis A
- o Prevnar 13

• 15 Months

- o DTaP
- o Hib

• 18 Months

- o Hepatitis A

• 4 Years

- o DTaP
- o Polio
- o MMR
- o Varivax

• 11 Years

- o Tdap
- o Meningococcal
- o Gardasil (Human Papilloma Virus)
 - Gardasil is a series of 3 shots: the first, then the second 2 months later and the third 6 months after the second.

• 16-17 Years

- o Meningococcal
